

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

ZIPPE Industrieanlagen приобрела стекольный бизнес Lahti Precision. Новое подразделение Lahti приносит дополнительные компетенции, например, в области взвешивания сырья, к тому же мы будем сотрудничать в области исследований и разработок, чтобы создать выдающиеся технологические решения, потенциал которых теперь станет заметно выше», — сообщил Филипп Циппе.

### Конференция в Мурано



В начале июня в итальянском городе Мурано, хорошо известном своей богатой историей стекловарения, прошла Конференция международных ассоциаций стекольной промышленности, организованная компанией Vitrum при поддержке ИТА (Итальянское торговое агентство). На конференцию приехали делегации из Австралии, Бельгии, Бразилии, Финляндии, Соединенного Королевства, Словакии, Испании, Соединенных Штатов, Швейцарии, России и Италии. Обсуждались наиболее актуальные вопросы мира стекла. Основное внимание уделяно технической и производственной стандартизации, образованию и обучению, истории и культуре, энергетике и охране окружающей среды. Участникам конференции продемонстрировали древнее искусство изготовления «бисера» — типичная венецианская ремесленная традиция изготовления стеклянных бусинок для ювелирных, браслетов и других украшений. Завершилась конференция посещением престижного музея Le Stanze del Vetro, посвященного истории культуры обработки стекла с начала 1900-х годов по настоящее время.


### Линия по производству облегченной бутылки



Предприятие «Сибирское стекло» ввело в эксплуатацию еще одну линию по производству бутылки методом NNPB. Это уже четвертая линия в стекольных комплексах индустриального парка «Экран», выпускающая облегченную тару. Первая линия NNPB начала работать в сентябре 2014 года, вторая — в октябре 2016-го (обе — на стекловаренной печи №5), третья — в июне 2017 года на печи №2. Четвертая линия установлена также на «второй» печи, на ней будут выпускать 63 миллиона бутылок в год. Если в 2014 году с конвейеров сошло 6 миллионов единиц стеклотары, сделанной по технологии NNPB, то в 2017-м — уже 133 миллиона единиц готовой продукции. В 2018 году изготавливается 205 миллионов единиц облегченной тары, которая пользуется повышенным спросом. Использование технологии NNPB при сохранении прочностных характеристик стеклоизделия, уменьшает его вес на 20–25%, благодаря чему заказчики экономят на транспортировке конечной продукции, а стеклозавод сокращает затраты на сырье.

## Celebrada en Murano la 2<sup>a</sup> Convención de Asociaciones Internacionales de la Industria de Vidrio

La segunda Convención de Asociaciones Internacionales de Vidrio, patrocinada por el certamen de la feria de Milán Vitrum e ITA (Agencia de Comercio Italiana), celebrada del 6 al 7 de junio en Murano (Venecia), obtuvo un considerable éxito de resultados, participación e innovación para el sector del vidrio. A la reunión acudieron representantes de diecisiete asociaciones internacionales del vidrio y representantes de los medios técnicos más importantes, llegados de todo el mundo, entre ellos Vitrea e Interempresas Media.

**D**urante los dos días que duró la convención, se celebraron varias sesiones técnicas en torno a los principales puntos de la industria. También hubo oportunidades para compartir impresiones y experiencias entre los asistentes y eventos paralelos con contenido artístico y cultural. Todo ello formó parte de la reunión de dos días en Murano, que vino a reforzar determinación de los organizadores y delegados de las principales asociaciones mundiales del vidrio de continuar su trabajo conjunto, con un esfuerzo de colaboración que, con el tiempo, puede perfeccionarse y mejorarse con una calidad y precisión aún mayor.

Avalado por el trabajo realizado en la primera reunión en Murano, en junio de 2017, y por la celebración de una reunión el 4 de octubre de 2017, en el marco de la 20<sup>a</sup> edición de Vitrum, la feria internacional del vidrio celebrada en Milán, el evento de Murano se celebró en la Stazione Sperimentale del Vetro, el internacionalmente acreditado laboratorio y centro de investigación, estudios, análisis y, en general, desarrollos técnicos en la industria del vidrio.

"Esta segunda reunión de las Asociaciones Internacionales de Vidrio confirma la importancia de comprender las verdaderas necesidades del mercado y las de sus protagonistas. Pero esto es solo el comienzo porque, si el año pasado pusimos las bases para un itinerario absolutamente innovador de la industria, este año logramos trazar las prioridades a seguir, conscientes de que los resultados concretos solo pueden ser visibles a medo y largo plazo. Además, si la Convención de Murano puede ya considerarse la reunión anual de primavera para la industria del vidrio, en Vitrum 2019 (del 1 al 4 de octubre en Milán) sin duda tendremos la oportunidad de actualizarnos y alinear nuestras intenciones de aumentar el valor de la industria en todo el mundo", comentó el presidente de Vitrum, Dino Zandonella Necca, al clíre de la convención.

"En los últimos 12 meses -explica Laura Biason, directora de Vitrum- desde la primera edición de la Convención, hemos continuado fortaleciendo el vínculo entre todos los delegados que participaron el año pasado, al tiempo que nos relacionamos con los nuevos actores de la industria. Tuvimos éxito; y esta fue otra gran satisfacción para nosotros porque significa que estamos en el camino correcto. Nos complacer dar la bienvenida en nuestra comunidad a la asociación de vidrio plano de Finlandia, como nuevo miembro este año, y a dos nuevos representantes de Brasil y Eslovaquia.

Pero los desarrollos más recientes no terminan allí. Gracias a nuestros objetivos compartidos, también se pudo completar la lista de temas de discusión que en el año pasado empezaron a delinearse. La comunicación y la información ocupan el lugar que les corresponde entre los temas prioritarios, junto con la estandarización técnica y de producción, la educación, la capacitación, la historia y la cultura, la energía y la administración ambiental. Como es cierto para todos los sectores productivos, el elemento de 'promoción' es esencial para nuestra industria. Nos incumbe transmitir a los medios una comprensión de la verdadera esencia de nuestros esfuerzos, basados en los principios de cooperación y acción conjunta, que no pueden hacer otra cosa que trabajar en beneficio de todos".

En la convención, hubo representantes de Australia, Bélgica, Brasil, Finlandia, Francia, Alemania, Países Bajos, el Reino Unido, Polonia, Rusia, Eslovaquia, España, Suiza, Estados Unidos y, por supuesto, Italia. Las experiencias compartidas por estos países fueron esenciales para el desarrollo fructífero de la convención. En tres sesiones de trabajo intensivas, todas las delegaciones presentaron casos de estudios, planes, objetivos y, no menos importante, sus necesidades.

"Todas las experiencias han sido muy atractivas y, en algunos casos, muy conmovedoras -señala Zandonella- porque ayudaron a poner en orden una reflexión grupal. Fortalecer los esfuerzos de I + D y apoyar a las empresas, especialmente las pequeñas y medianas, en la interpretación del lenguaje normativo relativo a la industria del vidrio en Italia y en el extranjero, son sin duda imprescindibles.

También se observó que, en algunas áreas (el caso específico de Brasil fue el centro de un largo análisis), la situación económica ha tenido un impacto considerable en el 'bienestar' de la industria y sus trabajadores. Se hizo una llamada en hacer un esfuerzo colectivo para emprender acciones específicas en términos de capacitación para ayudar y preparar a los trabajadores locales con el objetivo de mantenerse al día en los procedimientos competitivos del mercado global".


"Nuestro sentido de comunidad -agregó Biason- vuelve a ser evidente en estos contextos porque al compartir los proyectos y los resultados logrados, así como las dificultades enfrentadas en el camino, es posible ver los problemas desde diferentes perspectivas. Y, a menudo, eso significa encontrar una interpretación que podría ser la solución ganadora".

### Programa de jornadas paralelas

Además de las sesiones de trabajo, los delegados y representantes de las 15 publicaciones técnicas disfrutaron de un variado programa de eventos paralelos que mostró otros dos aspectos sorprendentes de la tradición del vidrio de Murano.

El jueves 7 de junio se inició con la exposición de cuentas de Lisette Caputo. También organizado de Arts 'Connection, un festival que promueve el renacimiento del vidrio de Murano a través de la cultura, Caputo demostró la manufactura detallada y las fases de procesamiento que entran en la fabricación de cuentas de vidrio, en consonancia con la antigua tradición local que hoy es de dominio exclusivo de 50 artesanos y artistas. La audiencia internacional siguió con interés y respeto todo el proceso y no dudó en pedir detalles sobre los aspectos más complicados y fascinantes del mismo.

La visita continuó con una parada en la espléndida Basílica de San Giorgio de Palladio y las Capillas del Vaticano, el primer Pabellón de la Santa Sede en la Exposición Internacional de Arquitectura, en el marco de la Biennale di Venezia.

Time has also been set aside for less intense parallel events. Like a demonstration (on Thursday June 7) of the ancient "bead-makers" art, the typically Venetian artisan tradition of making glass beads for necklaces, bracelets and other jewelry – an experience that encapsulates centuries of skills and cultural aesthetics, passed down from one generation to the next.

This treasure-trove of knowledge is awaiting UNESCO designation as an Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity, following a proposal made in 2013 by three different, and geographically distant locations, but with a common bond in the art of bead-making: Venice, Paris and Ghana.

The second Convention of International Glass Industry Associations will conclude with a visit to "Le Stanze del Vetro" on the island of San Giorgio, in partnership with the Fondazione Giorgio Cini. Fondazione Cini is a cultural center of international caliber that hosts year-round research activities, exhibits and meetings, shows and concerts as well as conferences held by qualified scientific and cultural organizations. Convention attendees will make an exclusive visit to "Le Stanze del Vetro", the prestigious gallery-museum dedicated to the history and culture of glass processing from the early 1900s to the present.

Vitrum's Convention of the International Glass Industry Associations will take place on 6-7th June this year at the Stazione Sperimentale del Vetro (SSV) in Murano, Venice.

This year, the two-day meeting will bring together global leaders from the world of glass in Italy. Vitrum (Italy's international glass exhibition) and the Italian Trade Agency (ITA) organised the convention.

The first successful meeting was in 2017 and it led to another meeting in October at Vitrum in Milan, where relationships were strengthened.

Delegates will attend the convention in Murano, the island of glass, from countries all over the world. This includes Australia, Belgium, Brazil, Finland, the United Kingdom, Russia, Slovakia, Spain, the United States, Switzerland and Italy. Representatives from 15 international glass industry publications have also been invited to attend.

Topics that will be discussed include technical and production standardisation, education and training, history and culture, energy and environmental stewardship. These topics were identified as priorities by all the delegates a year ago and will be analysed in depth by various representatives this year, based on the latest developments and new requirements.

Other activities include a demonstration of ancient 'beadmakers' art, the typically Venetian artisan tradition of making glass beads for necklaces, bracelets and other jewelry.

# Internationale glasorganisaties houden tweede conventie

6 juni 2018 | 18 keer bekeken

Op initiatief van de [glasbeurs Vitrum](#) en met de steun van ITA (het Italiaans handelsagentschap), vindt vanaf vandaag de tweede conventie van internationale glasorganisaties plaats. Het evenement van de [Internationale Glasindustrie Associaties \(IGA\)](#) vindt plaats op 6 en 7 juni in Murano (Venetië).

Na de oprichtingsbijeenkomst in juni 2017 werden in oktober tijdens Vitrum 2017 de relaties versterkt. En nu zullen de leidende vertegenwoordigers van de wereldwijde glasindustrie elkaar opnieuw ontmoeten op het eiland van glas. Internationale glasorganisaties uit Australië, België, Brazilië, Finland, het Verenigd Koninkrijk, Rusland, Slowakije, Spanje, de Verenigde Staten, Zwitserland en, uiteraard, Italië, zullen aanwezig zijn. Vertegenwoordigers van vijftien internationale uitgaven in de glasindustrie, waaronder Glas in Beeld, zijn ook uitgenodigd om de tweedaagse bijeenkomst bij te wonen.

Vanmiddag zullen de delegaties bijeenkomen op het kantoor van het Stazione Sperimentale del Vetro, onderzoekscentrum en wereldwijd referentiepunt voor bedrijven, verenigingen, universiteiten en instellingen die verbonden zijn met de wereld van glas. De meest actuele onderwerpen uit de wereld van glas zullen worden besproken, waaronder technische en productiestandaardisatie, onderwijs en opleiding, geschiedenis en cultuur en energie en milieubeheer. Morgen staat een demonstratie van de typisch Venetiaanse ambachtelijke traditie van het maken van glaskralen voor kettingen, armbanden en andere sieraden op het programma. Dit ambacht in Venetië is Unesco beschermd, evenals dat van de kralenmakers in Parijs en Ghana. De tweede IGA Conventie wordt afgesloten met een bezoek aan 'Le Stanze del Vetro' op het eiland San Giorgio, het museum gewijd aan de geschiedenis en cultuur van glasverwerking van de vroege jaren 1900 tot heden.

### Internationale Glasverbände treffen sich in Murano

Auf der venezianischen Insel Murano haben sich unter der Federführung von Vitrum und Gimav heute zum zweiten Mal internationale Glasverbände getroffen, um sich über Herausforderungen und Lösungen für die Branche auszutauschen. Dem deutschen VDMA Forum Glastechnik geht es beispielsweise um die Standardisierung von Schnittstellen oder die Digitalisierung. „Wir nutzen die Veranstaltung für den Austausch – um im Gespräch zu bleiben. Es gibt viele Dinge, die wir gemeinsam angehen können und sollten“, sagt Gesine Bergmann im Gespräch mit GFF.



## The second Convention of Glass Associations discuss the future of glass

This year's **Convention of Glass Associations** was held on 6<sup>th</sup>-7<sup>th</sup> June on the glassmaking island of Murano, Italy with 15 associations in attendance from all around the globe.



The second convention was held at the Stazione Sperimentale del Vetro (SSV) and organised by Vitrum and the Italian Trade Agency (ITA).

Organiser and Vitrum President, Dino Zandonella Necca, said: "This is a fantastic venue and I'm very happy that we can communicate the history and the future of the glass industry."

"I'd like to thank the Italian Trade Agency who is responsible for this."

"The Italian Trade Agency views the glass industry in Italy as one of its most important industries."

"We [usually] have nearly 48% foreign and 52% Italian visitors."

"We think Vitrum would be a good meeting point for the associations."

Each association gave a 10-minute presentation outlining the role of their organisation as well as the challenges and opportunities they face.

A particularly interesting presentation was by the Glass and Glazing Federation (GGF) about security and safety glazing. The presentation covered how we could minimise the risks in built up areas from terrorists, incidents, natural disasters and man made tragedies. Key points included the education of governments, house builders and homeowners.

Associations that participated in the two-day event included GIMAV, VDMA, Abravidro, AGGA, Steklosouz, ATIV, the International Commission on Glass and Glass for Europe.

On the second day, an activity included an art demonstration by the glass artist and 'perlera', Lisette A. Caputo of Maison Lisette Murano. Ms Caputo practises the ancient Venetian artisan tradition of making glass beads for necklaces, bracelets and other jewellery.

The associations then had a follow-up discussion of what has happened in the year since the last conference and what the goals were before the next meeting. Topics included technical and production standardisation, education and training, history and culture, energy and environmental stewardship.

The event also included a visit to the Holy See Pavilion, San Giorgio Church and Le Stanze del Vetro, a prestigious gallery-museum dedicated to the history and culture of glass processing from the early 1900s, on the island of San Giorgio.

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## 16 Associations Come Together in Italy to Strengthen Relationships, Share Information

Representatives from 16 professional glass groups from throughout the world gathered together late last week to discuss common challenges and share information during the Second Annual International Convention of Glass Industry Associations in Murano, Venice, Italy. Three new associations joined the meeting's ranks this year — Abravidro (The Brazilian Association of Flat Glass), The Finnish Association of Flat Glass and FunGlass (The Centre for Functional and Surface Functionalized Glass) based in Trenčín, Slovakia.

The event was organized by Vitrum and supported by the Italian Trade Agency (ITA). Associations from 11 countries were represented, including Australia, Belgium, Brazil, Finland, the United Kingdom, Russia, Slovakia, Spain, Germany, Switzerland and Italy.



The goal of the Second Annual International Convention of Glass Industry Associations is to share knowledge and best practices to help each group overcome common challenges and help the glass industry as a whole.

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Iara Bentes of Abravidro discusses the state of the glass industry in Brazil.

The event began with introductions from representatives of new associations. Iara Bentes represented Abravidro, one of the largest glass associations in Brazil, which includes almost 200 glass companies. The group covers the entire gamut of glass from construction to automotive to furniture, decorative and major appliances. Since 1998, Abravidro hosts the Brazilian Committee for Technical Standards (ABNT/CB-37), which is responsible for the production and revision of the technical standards for the sector.

In addition to offering education initiatives and legislative support, Abravidro also publishes an annual report analyzing the Brazilian flat glass sector. Tempered glass is the most popular glass product in Brazil, followed by mirrors, laminated, table top glass and insulating glass. The revenues of tempered glass are down almost 3 percent from 2016 to 2017, while laminated glass revenues are down 18 percent.

"Pricing is going down," noted Bentes. "The crisis is hurting the construction sector."

The crisis she referred to was sparked by the investigation into a massive government bribery ring which fed into an economic downturn as Brazil prepared to host the 2016 Summer Olympics in Rio de Janeiro. Politicians, billionaires and corporate executives have been jailed, according to CNN.

However, Bentes, noted that employee numbers at glass companies are on the upturn. This points to a more positive future, she said.



Jenni Heikkila took the stage next representing the Finnish Association of Flat Glass, which was established in 1997. It has 130 member companies and its main goals are to raise the quality of glass in building construction, as well as influence legislation, standards and guides. One of the group's recent initiatives was introducing a glass design software to the Finnish market as no software was available. The Finnish group has been working closely with Norway and Sweden.

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They share information since the regulations and laws are similar in their countries. She pointed out that her group is interested in learning about the standards established by other countries and sees education as a growing part of her association.

Jenni Heikkila of the Finnish Association of Flat Glass discusses her group's recent initiative to introduce a glass design software to the Finnish market.

The third new association to present was FunGlass (The Centre for Functional and Surface Functionalized Glass). It represents 40 researchers from Slovakia, Spain, Germany and Italy. Martin Michalek represented this group. It is a project supported by the Eighth European Framework program for Research and Innovation Horizon 2020. Their goal is to create an advanced glass center that promotes guidelines and advancements. The new center will specialize in research in the area of glasses with special functional properties (luminescence and electric), and to the functionalization of conventional glasses with the aim of modification of their properties and adding new functionalities. These would comprise reflection and anti-reflection coatings for solar energy production and optoelectronic applications, increase of glass strength, enhancing the corrosion and leaching resistance of commercially produced glasses and low-maintenance/antibacterial coatings of glasses for medical applications, including modification/enhancement of bioactivity.

Other groups that participated were the Australian Glass and Glazing Association, AIHV (which represents a European coalition of countries and also has a board member from the United States), Storia Del Vetro (the Italian National AIHV Committee), GIMAV (based in Milan, Italy), Glass for Europe (based in Brussels, Belgium), Glass and Glazing Federation (based in London, England), The International Council of Museums (based in Paris, France), the International Commission on Glass (which represents an international coalition of countries), the Slovak Glass Society (based in Slovakia), the National United Council of Glass Industry (based in Russia), ATIV (based in Parma, Italy), Assovetro (based in Rome, Italy) and The Mechanical Engineering Industry Association (based in Frankfurt, Germany).

The groups established committees on several key topics, including technical and production standardization, education and training, history and culture, and energy and environmental stewardship. The goal is to share knowledge and best practices to help each group overcome common challenges and help the glass industry as a whole.

"If someone has done it before, why do we have to keep reproducing it over and over again with limited resources," asked Dino Zandonella Necca, president of Vitrum, suggesting a pooling of knowledge. Members of the group will meet again at glasstec in October 2018 to further develop the committees. The groups were also in favor of continuing an annual meeting of associations in Murano, Venice, Italy.

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**The agenda focused on new topics and priorities crucial to the industry's future.**


Sponsored by Vitrum and ITA, the two-day meeting June 6-7, 2018 convened the leading global representatives of the world of glass. Discussion focused on current needs, projects and experiences of domestic and international significance

The second Convention of International Glass Associations, sponsored by Vitrum and ITA (Italian Trade Agency) held June 6-7 in Murano (Venice), marked another success in terms of results, turnout, and progress. It included technical sessions revolving around the industry's main focal points; opportunities for sharing; and parallel events with artistic and cultural content. All part of the two-day Murano meeting that reinforced the determination of the organizers and delegates from the leading global glass associations to continue their work – together – as a collaborative effort that, over time, can be further refined and enhanced with even greater quality and precision.

Validating the work accomplished at the first meeting in Murano, in June of 2017 and on October 4, 2017, during the 20th edition of Vitrum, the International Glass Show in Milan, the Murano event took place at the Stazione Sperimentale del Vetro, a high-level research center and lab, internationally accredited for surveys, studies, analyses and, in general, technical developments in the glass industry.

"This second meeting of the International Glass Associations confirms the importance of understanding the true market needs and those of its players. But, this is just the beginning because, if last year we laid the groundwork for an absolutely innovative industry journey, this year we managed to map out the priorities to be pursued, aware that concrete results may only be visible in the medium-long term. And, if the Murano Convention can now be deemed the annual spring meeting for the glass industry, at Vitrum 2019 (October 1-4 in Milan) we will certainly have the opportunity to update ourselves and fuel our intentions to increase the value of the industry around the world", remarked Vitrum President, Dino Zandonella Necca, at the close of the convention.

"Over the last 12 months – explains Laura Biason, director of Vitrum – since the first edition of the Convention – we have continued to strengthen the bond among all the delegates who participated last year, while also engaging with new industry players. We succeeded; and this was another huge satisfaction for us because it means we are on the right track. We were pleased to welcome in our Community Finland, as a new member this year, and two new representatives from Brazil and Slovakia. But the latest developments don't end there. Thanks to our shared objectives, we were also able to complete the list of discussion topics we outlined last year. Communication and information took their rightful place among the priority topics, alongside technical and production standardization, education and training, history and culture, energy and environmental stewardship. As is true for all manufacturing sectors, the element of 'promotion' is essential to our industry. It is incumbent upon us to convey to the media an understanding of the true essence of our efforts here, based on the principles of cooperation and concerted action, that cannot help but work to everyone's advantage".

Australia, Belgium, Brazil, Finland, France, Germany, Netherlands, the UK, Poland, Russia, Slovakia, Spain, Switzerland, United States and, of course, Italy. The experiences shared by these countries were central to the 2018 convention. In three intensive work sessions, all the delegations presented case studies, plans, aims and, last but not least, their needs.

"All very compelling and, in some cases, very moving experiences – notes Zandonella – because they commanded group reflection. Strengthening R&D efforts and supporting businesses, especially small and medium-sized ones, in interpreting legislative language pertaining to the glass industry in Italy and abroad, are certainly a must. It was also noted that, in some areas (the specific case of Brazil was at the heart of a lengthy analysis) the economic situation has had a considerable impact on the 'wellbeing' of the industry and its workers. A call was made for a collective effort for targeted actions in terms of training to assist and prepare the local workers to keep pace with the competitive procedures in the global market".

"Our sense of Community – added Biason – is again apparent in these contexts because by sharing the projects and outcomes achieved, as well as the difficulties faced along the way, it is possible to see the issues from different perspectives. And, often, that means finding an interpretation that could be the winning solution".

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In addition to the work sessions, the delegates and representatives of the 15 trade publications were treated to a much-appreciated program of parallel events that showcased two other amazing aspects of Murano's glass tradition. Thursday, June 7th began with Lisette Caputo's bead-making exhibition.

Also an organizer of Arts' connection, a festival that promotes the renaissance of Murano glass through culture, Caputo demonstrated the detailed workmanship and processing phases that go into glass bead making, in keeping with the ancient local tradition that today is the domain of only about 50 "die-hard" artisans and artists. Discerning and involved, the international audience did not hesitate to ask for details about the more complicated and fascinating aspects of the process.

In the afternoon, after an exclusive tour of the Venice lagoon, the group visited the island of San Giorgio Maggiore, where "Le Stanze del Vetro" (a renowned cultural center - joint venture by Fondazione Giorgio Cini and Pentagram Stiftung) is headquartered, for a guided tour of the "A furnace in Marseille. Cirva" exhibit, curated by Isabelle Reiher (director of CIRVA - Centre International de Recherche sur le Verre et les Arts plastiques in Marseille) and Chiara Bertola (curator of contemporary art at the Fondazione Querini Stampalia).

The tour continued with a stop at Palladio's splendid San Giorgio Basilica, and the Vatican Chapels, the Holy See's first Pavilion at the International Architecture Exhibition – La Biennale di Venezia.

En la convención, hubo representes de Australia, Bélgica, Brasil, Finlandia, Francia, Alemania, Países Bajos, el Reino Unido, Polonia, Rusia, Eslovaquia, España, Suiza, Estados Unidos y, por supuesto, Italia. Las experiencias compartidas por estos países fueron esenciales para el desarrollo fructífero de la convención. En tres sesiones de trabajo intensivas, todas las delegaciones presentaron casos de estudios, planes, objetivos y, no menos importante, sus necesidades.

"Todas las experiencias han sido muy atractivas y, en algunos casos, muy conmovedoras -señala Zandonella- porque ayudaron a poner en orden una reflexión grupal. Fortalecer los esfuerzos de I + D y apoyar a las empresas, especialmente las pequeñas y medianas, en la interpretación del lenguaje normativo relativo a la industria del vidrio en Italia y en el extranjero, son sin duda imprescindibles. También se observó que, en algunas áreas (el caso específico de Brasil fue el centro de un largo análisis), la situación económica ha tenido un impacto considerable en el 'bienestar' de la industria y sus trabajadores. Se hizo una llamada en hacer un esfuerzo colectivo para emprender acciones específicas en términos de capacitación para ayudar y preparar a los trabajadores locales con el objetivo de mantenerse al día en los procedimientos competitivos del mercado global".

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"Nuestro sentido de comunidad -agregó Biason- vuelve a ser evidente en estos contextos porque al compartir los proyectos y los resultados logrados, así como las dificultades enfrentadas en el camino, es posible ver los problemas desde diferentes perspectivas. Y, a menudo, eso significa encontrar una interpretación que podría ser la solución ganadora".

### Programa de jornadas paralelas

Además de las sesiones de trabajo, los delegados y representantes de las 15 publicaciones técnicas disfrutaron de un variado programa de eventos paralelos que mostró otros dos aspectos sorprendentes de la tradición del vidrio de Murano. El jueves 7 de junio se inició con la exposición de cuentas de Lisette Caputo. También organizador de Arts 'Connection, un festival que promueve el renacimiento del vidrio de Murano a través de la cultura, Caputo demostró la manufactura detallada y las fases de procesamiento que entran en la fabricación de cuentas de vidrio, en consonancia con la antigua tradición local que hoy es de dominio exclusivo de 50 artesanos y artistas. La audiencia internacional siguió con interés y respeto todo el proceso y no dudó en pedir detalles sobre los aspectos más complicados y fascinantes del mismo.



The second Convention of International Glass Associations, sponsored by Vitrum and ITA (Italian Trade Agency) held 6-7 June in Murano (Venice), with technical sessions revolving around the industry's main focal points; opportunities for sharing; and parallel events with artistic and cultural content. The two-day Murano meeting reinforced the determination of the organizers and delegates from the leading global glass associations to continue their

work – together – as a collaborative effort that, over time, can be further refined and enhanced with even greater quality and precision.

Validating the work accomplished at the first meeting in Murano, in June 2017 and on 4 October 2017, during the 20th edition of Vitrum, the International Glass Show in Milan, the Murano event took place at the Stazione Sperimentale del Vetro, a high-level research center and lab, internationally accredited for surveys, studies, analyses and, in general, technical developments in the glass industry.

"This second meeting of the International Glass Associations confirms the importance of understanding the true market needs and those of its players. But, this is just the beginning because, if last year we laid the groundwork for an absolutely innovative industry journey, this year we managed to map out the priorities to be pursued, aware that concrete results may only be visible in the medium-long term. And, if the Murano Convention can now be deemed the annual spring meeting for the glass industry, at Vitrum 2019 (1-4 October in Milan) we will certainly have the opportunity to update ourselves and fuel our intentions to increase the value of the industry around the world", remarked Vitrum President, Dino Zandonella Necca, at the close of the convention.

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"Over the last 12 months – explains Laura Biason, director of Vitrum – since the first edition of the Convention – we have continued to strengthen the bond among all the delegates who participated last year, while also engaging with new industry players. We succeeded; and this was another huge satisfaction for us because it means we are on the right track. We were pleased to welcome in our Community Finland, as a new member this year, and two new representatives from Brazil and Slovakia. But the latest developments don't end there. Thanks to our shared objectives, we were also able to complete the list of discussion topics we outlined last year. Communication and information took their rightful place among the priority topics, alongside technical and production standardization, education and training, history and culture, energy and environmental stewardship. As is true for all manufacturing sectors, the element of 'promotion' is essential to our industry. It is incumbent upon us to convey to the media an understanding of the true essence of our efforts here, based on the principles of cooperation and concerted action, that cannot help but work to everyone's advantage".

Australia, Belgium, Brazil, Finland, France, Germany, Netherlands, the UK, Poland, Russia, Slovakia, Spain, Switzerland, United States and, of course, Italy. The experiences shared by these countries were central to the 2018 convention. In three intensive work sessions, all the delegations presented case studies, plans, aims and, last but not least, their needs.

"All very compelling and, in some cases, very moving experiences – notes Zandonella – because they commanded group reflection. Strengthening R&D efforts and supporting businesses, especially small and medium-sized ones, in interpreting legislative language pertaining to the glass industry in Italy and abroad, are certainly a must. It was also noted that, in some areas (the specific case of Brazil was at the heart of a lengthy analysis) the economic situation has had a considerable impact on the 'wellbeing' of the industry and its workers. A call was made for a collective effort for targeted actions in terms of training to assist and prepare the local workers to keep pace with the competitive procedures in the global market".

"Our sense of Community – added Biason – is again apparent in these contexts because by sharing the projects and outcomes achieved, as well as the difficulties faced along the way, it is possible to see the issues from different perspectives. And, often, that means finding an interpretation that could be the winning solution".

In addition to the work sessions, the delegates and representatives of the 15 trade publications were treated to a much-appreciated program of parallel events that showcased two other amazing aspects of Murano's glass tradition. Thursday, 7 June began with Lisette Caputo's bead-making exhibition. Also an organizer of Arts' connection, a festival that promotes the renaissance of Murano glass through culture, Caputo demonstrated the detailed workmanship and processing phases that go into glass bead making, in keeping with the ancient local tradition that today is the domain of only about 50 "die-hard" artisans details about the more complicated and fascinating aspects of the process.

In the afternoon, after an exclusive tour of the Venice lagoon, the group visited the island of San Giorgio Maggiore, where "Le Stanze del Vetro" (a renowned cultural center - joint venture by Fondazione Giorgio Cini and Pentagram Stiftung) is headquartered, for a guided tour of the "A furnace in Marseille. Cirva" exhibit, curated by Isabelle Reiher (director of CIRVA - Centre International de Recherche sur le Verre et les Arts plastiques in Marseille) and Chiara Bertola (curator of contemporary art at the Fondazione Querini Stampalia). The tour continued with a stop at Palladio's splendid San Giorgio Basilica, and the Vatican Chapels, the Holy See's first Pavilion at the International Architecture Exhibition – La Biennale di Venezia.

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
Making glass the material that the building and construction sectors cannot do without; strengthening its ever more protagonist role with regards to renewable energy, but also in niche sectors such as high-tech, advanced telecommunications; becoming a 'critical force' towards the most important European political parties to promote changes and updated of standards and regulations for the sector; incentivizing the development of solutions able to focus on energy savings and efficiency; foster technical consultations at all levels and around the world for the promotion of good practices; responding to the growing need of communication in the sector, leveraging on the importance of transferring to the general public the importance of the everyday use of glass; promoting culture, education and a high level of continuous updating in companies; and last but not least, enhance the concept of network, so that in one big community the new workers and also historical operators of the sector can confront and stimulate new ideas with each other, drawing from a technical, historical and artistic culture that is accessible to future generations. ### International Glass Groups Gather in Venice, Italy, to Strengthen Relationships

Representatives from 16 professional glass groups from throughout the world gathered together in June to discuss common challenges and share information during the Second Annual International Convention of Glass Industry Associations in Murano, Venice, Italy. Three new associations joined the meeting's ranks this year — Abravidro (The Brazilian Association of Flat Glass), The Finnish Association of Flat Glass and FunGlass (The Centre for Functional and Surface Functionalized Glass) based in Trenčín, Slovakia.

The event was organized by Vitrum and supported by the Italian Trade Agency (ITA). Associations from 11 countries were represented, including Australia, Belgium, Brazil, Finland, the United Kingdom, Russia, Slovakia, Spain, Germany, Switzerland and Italy.

Iara Bentes represented Abravidro, one of the largest glass associations in Brazil, which includes almost 200 glass companies.

According to Abravidro's annual report, tempered glass is the most popular glass product in Brazil, followed by mirrors, laminated, table top glass and insulating glass. The revenues of tempered glass are down almost 3 percent from 2016 to 2017, while laminated glass revenues are down 18 percent.

However, Bentes noted that employee numbers at glass companies are on the upturn. This points to a more positive future, she said.

Jenni Heikkila represented the Finnish Association of Flat Glass. It is 21 years old and has 130 member companies. Its main goals are to raise the quality of glass in building construction, as well as influence legislation, standards and guides. One of the group's recent

initiatives was introducing a glass design software to the Finnish market as no software was available. The Finnish group has been working closely with Norway and Sweden. They share information since the regulations and laws are similar in their countries.

FunGlass (The Centre for Functional and Surface Functionalized Glass) represents 40 researchers from Slovakia, Spain, Germany and Italy. It is a project supported by the Eighth European Framework program for Research and Innovation Horizon 2020. Their goal is to create an advanced glass center that promotes guidelines and advancements. According to FunGlass representative Martin Michalek, the new center will specialize in research in the area of glasses with special functional properties (luminescence and electric), and to the functionalization of conventional glasses with the aim of modification

of their properties and adding new functionalities.

The 16 glass groups established committees on several key topics, including technical and production standardization, education and training, history and culture, and energy and environmental stewardship. The goal is to share knowledge and best practices to help each group overcome common challenges and help the glass industry as a whole.

"If someone has done it before, why do we have to keep reproducing it over and over again with limited resources," asked Dino Zandonella Necca, president of Vitrum, suggesting a pooling of knowledge. Members of the group will meet again at glasstec in October 2018 to further develop the committees. The groups were also in favor of continuing an annual meeting of associations in Murano, Venice, Italy. —Jenna Reed

# Murano acoge la II Convención de Asociaciones Internacionales de la Industria del Vidrio

## Internationale Glasverbände festigen die Zusammenarbeit

Auf Einladung der Vitrum hat in Murano das zweite Treffen internationaler Glasverbände stattgefunden. Vergangenes Jahr war der Startschuss für den Event gefallen, der den Dialog zwischen den Verbänden stärken und gemeinsame Themen in den Vordergrund rücken soll.



In Murano versammelten sich Vertreter von Glasverbänden u.a. aus Australien, Deutschland, Italien, der Schweiz, Spanien, Russland und den USA.

„Über die zurückliegenden zwölf Monate hinweg haben wir die Bande zwischen den Teilnehmern gestärkt und zusätzlich um das Engagement weiterer Branchenplayer geworben“, sagt Vitrum-Direktorin Laura Biason. Mit Erfolg: Mit dem finnischen Verband für Flachglas, dem brasilianischen Verband Abravidro und der internationalen Forschungsvereinigung FunGlass mit Sitz in der Slowakei ergänzen drei weitere Organisationen die Gemeinschaft der in Murano versammelten Glasverbände.

**Was die Verbände bewegen**  
In drei Arbeitssessions präsentierten die einzelnen Delegationen – Markt für Markt, Land für Land – jüngste Entwicklungen, neue Herausforderungen sowie Pläne und Ziele ihrer Arbeit. Im Vordergrund standen die Themen Kommunikation und Information, Standardisierung, Aus- und Weiterbildung, Geschichte und Kultur sowie Energie und Umweltschutz, die sich im vergangenen Jahr länder-

übergreifend als wichtigste Themen herauskristallisiert hatten. Aus Deutschland waren Vertreter des Verbands deutscher Maschinen- und Anlagenhersteller (VDMA) angereist. Sie hatten eine Reihe von Punkten im Gepäck, bei denen sie sich eine Zusammenarbeit über nationale Grenzen hinweg vorstellen könnten. Dazu zählen die Bereiche Standardisierung, Digitalisierung, technische Regularien sowie Umweltgesetzgebung. „Das Finden gemeinsamer Schnittstellen ist ein wichtiges Thema im Maschinenbau“, sagte Günther Mlynar im Gespräch mit GFF.


Für ihn und Gesine Bergmann vom VDMA Forum Glastechnik stand beim Treffen in Murano der gegenseitige Austausch im Vordergrund. „Wir wollen im Gespräch bleiben.“ Bergmann regte an, neben dem VDMA weitere Verbände aus Deutschland wie den Bundesverband Flachglas (BF), den BV Glas oder insbesondere den Bundesinnungsverband des Glasherstellers (BIV) zum Treffen einzuladen – bei vielen anderen internationalen Verbänden stehe schließlich auch das Handwerk im Fokus; so wie beim australischen Verband AGGA, der es, wie Patrick Gavaghan erläuterte, mit verschiedenen Initiativen und Qualifizierungsprogrammen geschafft habe, die Zahl der Auszubildenden kontinuierlich zu erhöhen – mit weiterhin steigender Tendenz. „Glas ist ein hochtechnisches Produkt. Wir brauchen qualifizierte Fachkräfte, die es verarbeiten können.“

**Hausaufgaben bis 2019**  
In Murano wohlgefühlt haben dürfte sich Bertrand Cazes. Als Generalsekretär von Glass for Europe ist er es gewohnt, mit verschiedenen nationalen Glasverbänden zusammenzuarbeiten. Er hob die Aktivitäten des europäischen Dachverbands hervor, die sich nach seinen Angaben in einem wesentlichen Punkt von denen der anderen Verbände unterscheiden. „Wir setzen uns für die Interessen der Flachglasbranche ein, indem wir versuchen, die Gesetzgebung auf EU-Ebene so zu gestalten, dass alle Akteure in der Branche von florierenden Geschäften profitieren“, sagte Cazes. Das Ziel sei es, Politikern den Mehrwert von Flachglasprodukten zu kommunizieren.

Für Laura Biason hat das zweitägige Treffen in Murano seinen Zweck erfüllt. Durch die einzelnen Vorträge sei es möglich gewesen, die fokussierten Themen aus verschiedenen Perspektiven zu betrachten. Das helft dabei, die richtige Lösung zu finden. Was die Teilnehmer von der Tagung als Hausaufgaben mitnehmen sollen, fasst Vitrum-Präsident Dr.-Ing. Dino Zandonelli Necca zusammen: „Anstrengungen in Forschung und Entwicklung zu stärken und Unternehmen, vor allem kleine und mittlere Betriebe, zu unterstützen, Gesetzes- und Normentexte richtig auszulegen, ist sicherlich ein Muss.“ Zudem gab es einen Aufruf zu kollektiven Anstrengungen und gezielten Maßnahmen bei der Aus- und Weiterbildung. „Die lokalen Arbeitnehmer müssen unterstützt werden, um im weltweiten Markt wettbewerbsfähig zu bleiben.“

### Vitrum-ITA convention touches on key issues

#### Italy

The second Convention of International Glass Associations, sponsored by Vitrum and ITA (Italian Trade Agency) held June 6-7 in Murano (Venice), marked another success in terms of results, turnout, and progress.

It included technical sessions revolving around the industry's main focal points; opportunities for sharing; and parallel events with artistic and cultural content. All part of the two-day Murano meeting that reinforced the determination of the organizers and delegates from the leading global glass associations to continue their work – together – as a collaborative effort that, over time, can be further refined and enhanced with even greater quality and precision.

Validating the work accomplished at the first meeting in Murano, in June of 2017 and on October 4, 2017, during the 20th edition of Vitrum, the International Glass Show in Milan, the Murano event took place at the Stazione Sperimentale del Vetro, a high-level research center and lab, internationally accredited for surveys, studies, analyses and, in general, technical developments in the glass industry.

"This second meeting of the International Glass Associations confirms the importance of understanding the true market needs and those of its players. But, this is just the beginning because, if last year we laid the groundwork for an absolutely innovative industry journey, this year we managed to map out the priorities to be pursued, aware that concrete results may only be visible in the medium-long term. And, if the Murano Convention can now be deemed the annual spring meeting for the glass industry, at Vitrum 2019 (October 1-4 in Milan) we will certainly have the opportunity to update ourselves and fuel our intentions to increase the value of the industry around the world", remarked Vitrum President, Dino Zandonella Necca, at the close of the convention.

"Over the last 12 months – explains Laura Biasion, director of Vitrum – since the first edition of the Convention – we have



continued to strengthen the bond among all the delegates who participated last year, while also engaging with new industry players. We succeeded; and this was another huge satisfaction for us because it means we are on the right track. We were pleased to welcome in our Community Finland, as a new member this year, and two new representatives from Brazil and Slovakia. But the latest developments don't end there. Thanks to our shared objectives, we were also able to complete the list of discussion topics we outlined last year. Communication and information took their rightful place among the priority topics, alongside technical and production standardization, education and training, history and culture, energy and environmental stewardship. As is true for all manufacturing sectors, the element of 'promotion' is essential to our industry. It is incumbent upon us to convey to the media an understanding of the true essence of our efforts here, based on the principles of cooperation and concerted action, that cannot help but work to everyone's advantage".

Australia, Belgium, Brazil, Finland, France, Germany, Netherlands, the UK, Poland, Russia, Slovakia, Spain, Switzerland, United States and, of course, Italy. The experiences shared by these countries were central to the 2018 convention. In three intensive work sessions, all the delegations presented case studies, plans, aims and, last but not least, their needs. "All very compelling and, in some cases, very moving experiences – notes Zandonella – because they commanded group reflection. Strengthening R&D efforts and supporting businesses, especially small and medium-sized ones, in interpreting legislative language pertaining to the glass industry in Italy and abroad, are certainly a must. It was also noted that, in some areas (the specific case of Brazil was at the heart of a lengthy analysis) the economic situation has had a considerable impact on the wellbeing of the industry and its workers. A call was made for a collective effort for targeted actions in terms of training to assist and prepare the local workers to keep pace with the competitive procedures in the global market".

"Our sense of Community – added Biasion – is again apparent in these contexts because by sharing the projects and outcomes achieved, as well as the difficulties faced along the way, it is possible to see the issues from different perspectives. And, often, that means finding an interpretation that could be the winning solution".

In addition to the work sessions, the delegates and representatives of the 15 trade publications were treated to a much-appreciated program of parallel events that showcased two other amazing aspects of Murano's glass tradition. Thursday, June 7th began with

Lisette Caputo's bead-making exhibition. Also an organizer of Arts' connection, a festival that promotes the renaissance of Murano glass through culture, Caputo demonstrated the detailed workmanship and processing phases that go into glass bead making, in keeping with the ancient local tradition that today is the domain of only about 50 "die-hard" artisans and artists. Discerning and involved, the international audience did not hesitate to ask for details about the more complicated and fascinating aspects of the process.

In the afternoon, after an exclusive tour of the Venice lagoon, the group visited the island of San Giorgio Maggiore, where "Le Stanze del Vetro" (a renowned cultural center - joint venture by Fondazione Giorgio Cini and Pentagram Stiftung) is headquartered, for a guided tour of the "A furnace in Marseille, Cirva" exhibit, curated by Isabelle Reither (director of Cirva - Centre International de Recherche sur le Verre et les Arts plastiques in Marseille) and Chiara Bertola (curator of contemporary art at the Fondazione Querini Stampalia). The tour continued with a stop at Palladio's splendid San Giorgio Basilica, and the Vatican Chapels, the Holy See's first Pavilion at the International Architecture Exhibition – La Biennale di Venezia.

В итальянском Мурано в июне 2018 года состоялся второй съезд национальных ассоциаций стекольной промышленности. На наши вопросы ответил Дино Зандонелла Некка, организатор этого мероприятия и выставки Vitrum.

Дино, расскажите нашим читателям о съезде ассоциаций подробней.
